Our Students

- English Language Arts and Math Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Test results were the highest in five years.
- Alberta Education reports demonstrated achievement exceed predicted results
- There were gains in Excellence on the Provincial Achievement Test results over the last two years.
- High School students consistently achieve good Diploma Exam results
- The high school drop-out rate is very low
- Schools continue developing a foundation in literacy and numeracy.

- Families report they value strong relationships and good communication with schools
- Many students and families express needs for supports beyond the classroom
- Schools are developing nurturing and responsive strategies to ensure students feel safe and cared for.
